VOLUNTEERS HELP MAKE THE BIKE RACE STORY SUCCESSFUL

Volunteers are the backbone of CPAM's Stationary Bike Race starting with a supportive and involved board. Not only do they attend meetings beforehand, to help make decisions, as needed, but they get into the mix by sporting teams, collecting pledges, working with the Pit Crew and otherwise pitching in on Race Day to ensure things go off without too many hitches. A lot of organization and planning goes into the event and they help with some of that too. I count myself lucky to have their ongoing support.



The board is not alone in its involvement. Both longtime faithful volunteers and a handful of new people make my job much easier and a lot more fun. I love the diversity of ideas and personalities among our volunteers. We sit down at a number of meetings and plan: how much and who will pick up the food, organizing the setting up and serving and a host of other details. More than 600 units of white and chocolate milk are schlepped to the Wellness, along with yoghurts, fruit and other delicious foods. Rick Tucker bakes more than 48 dozen bagels for us; they are picked up, still hot, after he's spent the night baking.

A civil engineer by trade, Amanda Shyiak was clearly a winner at our 2019 Stationary Bike Race. The Pit Crew are a special bunch; they seem to have their own code of communication between them and I'm in awe of their responsiveness to cyclists' needs. You know the mantra: if it can go wrong, it will do. Race Day is no



exception. Bikes suddenly wobble or skip a beat. Bikes need to be raised for taller riders and switched out for anyone who needs a special





Freedom ride. Freedom Concepts brings a full selection of sizes and models; they spend the day setting them up and moving them, helped by Pit Crew members.



Volunteers greet you when you arrive and register; they set up and keep the buffet table stocked and organized; help cyclists sign up for incentive prizes; manage a cloakroom and help facilitate t-shirt exchanges. Off the floor, they collect and bank pledges throughout the day in the Money Room.

Let's not forget the team captains and cyclists who make the work of other volunteers worthwhile by raising the money that keeps CPAM active all year round. Throughout the day, volunteers assist in recycling, and collecting the garbage generated by more than 900 people cycling, sweating, eating and enjoying a frantic fundraising day. Promptly at 4:45, when the last ride has been run and some trophies handed out, they dismantle and pack bikes, tables, chairs, signage, empty bottles and donut boxes before the Wellness Institute closes at seven p.m. sharp.

WESTMAN BIKE RACE – MARCH 2019


